





















PA Op1.12.1882 (PMG), PA closed 1903, PA re-opened 1.7.1907, SO 1.7.1908, PTA 1912, PO upgraded before 1986, continuous since then. According to Dickson this office is locate in the Cape on the overland route 'through Kaffraria'.During early days communication was with Natal given the fear that the Pondo people could be attacked by the Zulus or Khosa. It is unclear whether the office was controlled by Natal during the early days, which is likely given the canceller No. 1 on QV adhesive. Earliest recorded CoGH date stamp is 1899.
